Biographical/Historical Information:

Dr. Lewis Warrington Pendleton practiced medicine in Belfast from 1864 to 1880. He was born in Camden, Maine, 18 Mar 1844 and from Sep., 1862 to April, 1863, he served as Hospital Steward of the Twentieth Maine Regiment. He graduated from Albany Medical College in 1864, and began his practice in Belfast in November of that year. In 1880 he removed to Portland, Maine, where he established a successful practice. He died in Palm Beach, Florida on 11 Jan 1898 at the age of 53.

Scope and Contents:

A record of charges and payments for medical care for the families of many Belfast residents including, Joseph Williamson, Capt. Robert T. Emery, Hiram Chase, Ralph C. Johnson, Charles B. Hazeltine, Hiram O. Alden and William G. Crosby. He seems to have also invested in several Belfast built ships including a 32nd share in the Leonora and the Florida, and his accounts for these investments are intermingled with the patient accounts.
